Following the August 15th self-immolation of 29-year-old Tsewang Norbu, a monk from Nyitso monastery, thousands of armed Chinese troops have surrounded the monastery, harassing the monks and interrogating members of the local community. In recent weeks, three Tibetans from Tawu County have been arbitrarily detained by the Public Security Bureau and their current whereabouts remain unknown.

I call on you to immediately end the siege at Nyitso monastery and order the unconditional withdrawal of troops and other security forces from Tawu County. I also call for the immediate release of Norbu, Gyaltzen, and a third Tibetan, as well as anyone else arbitrarily detained in conjunction with Tsewang Norbu's self-immolation.
